I HAVE PAID MY DUES

ne major reason our Professors and Senior Consultants deteriorate over time instead of improving is absence from duty. "I have paid my dues" slogan is an arrogant way of hiding ignorance. You cannot be collecting salary while staying away from work.

When we were training we encountered Professors / Consultants and saw how diligent they were at work. If any Professor is worth the name then he/she should know that his/her presence should make a difference in both learning and patient care. Even in the undergraduate days we used to look forward to the Professor's ward round or clinic, where stuff was expected to be moved spontaneously with confidence. It is this type of attitude that is collapsing our profession, when those who are supposed to be role models are the main truants. In some countries Professors have no retirement age because their real presence (not present in absentia) in the system is said to add unquantifiable value since they are perceived as the repository of knowledge and experience. The absentee Professor or Consultant is an economic drain and a burden

to the system.

The problem is that we have tolerated this nonsense for too long, and it has become the norm. The same person who claims to have paid his dues will be very active in another facility where he earns less than 50% of what he earns in his primary place; just because it is an extra income and can only be earned justifiably.

But let me quickly point out that the matter of absenteeism is now not restricted to professors or senior consultants; the so called younger ones are even getting worse. Unfortunately, other healthcare workers have joined the 'evil train'! They will abandon their primary duties and be moving from one hospital to the other to collect peanuts for inputs higher than what they give to their primary places. Some hardly spend up to three hours in the hospital. In fact it is like the only way to really tell the system you are now a Consultant is to come to work or stay away at your discretion. So terrible!

Having said the above I feel very ashamed that all we concentrate on in discussions is money. We have never sought to see how services could be improved in the hospitals. We are not concerned about irresponsible



private practice going on almost everywhere. Negligent practices have become the order of the day and we are covering them up in the name of es-spirit-de corp. Delays in rendering services, some resulting in avoidable morbidities and mortalities. Funding has not been enough but the output we are having today is far too less than the input.

The NBA led the crusade for law reforms: we should lead the crusade for health system reforms too. Welfare and other matters should all be packaged into the reform package. 'Government should', is an old gramophone noise. What should government do? How exactly should it be done? By who specifically? When? At what cost? With what? What should be the expected outcomes? Let us aggregate our ideas and push them as a reform package. God bless!

Board Chairman Commends Abuja Metropolitan Lions Club for the Paediatric Oncology Centre

I am sure this will open the flood gate to other foundations and charity organisations to come and

show their milk of kindness," he said.

The President of Abuja Metropolitan Lions Club, Lion Charlz Jestus Opusunju, said the project which started in October 2020 and completed in March was a core project for the 2020/2021 Lions year.

Opusunju, who is the 11th President of the club said the project would also go a long way to bring succor to children with cancer.

The President said that children would also benefit from the services in the centre now and in the future. He added that the project lasted for a period of five months, had standard procedure carefully followed at the course of construction as was promise by the club.

"This edifice was built without any grant from the International office, no sponsorship or collaboration but completely with funds raised from friends and public spirited individuals at my investiture as President.

"My dream when I assumed office as President of Abuja Metropolitan Lions Club was to do something that will make the difference in the lives of children and families of children fighting cancer.

"This dream propelled me and the Board of Directors of the club to conduct a needs assessment of some centers providing oncology services in the FCT during which we saw the gaps in the Paediatrics oncology services in UATH," he said.


