# Minister of Health Commissions Critical Projects at UATH

The Honourable Minister of Health, Dr. Osagie Ehanire commissioned a 30-bedded world class Infectious Disease Care Centre in Gwagwalada on 25th September 2020, and officially handed it over to the Management of University of Abuja Teaching Hospital. He said, "I am very proud that today, we now have an international standard centre where we can manage highly pathogenic infectious disease cases, including critical medical and laboratory equipments...With laboratory testing and case management in one location, there is a much shorter time between sample collection and infection confirmation. This will ensure early initiation of treatment and thus mitigate mortality during infectious disease outbreaks". He also stated that the government looks forward to replicating this model in all states in Nigeria.

In a speech by Dr. Chikwe Ihekweazu, the Director General for the Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), he said the project commenced in 2019 due to the urgent need for a center to manage infectious disease after the outbreak of the Lassa Fever. Following the outbreak of the Corona Virus ravaging the world, Ihekweazu noted that no investment is too small in the healthcare industry.

The Chief Medical Director of UATH, Prof. Bissallah A. Ekele assured all present at the event that the hospital Management is committed to making optimal use of the facility for all infectious

diseases cases.

He applauded the NCDC for their support to the FCT Administration in the area of training, provision of medical supplies, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and the quick deployment of the rapid response team during emergencies.

Prof. Ekele also said with the addition of the new facilities, the Hospital has been converted from a 350- bed to a 520-bed Teaching

Hospital, the biggest in FCT, Abuja! Dr. Ehanire also commissioned the well equipped 32-bedded new Accident and Emergency facility and the Cardiology Unit, furnished for non-invasive procedures such as 4D Echocardiograph. In addition, he laid the foundation stone for a 64-bedded Mental Health Block which he said will provide specialized therapies when completed.

## Guidelines for Registration and Submission on Research Ethics Application System (REAPS)

The University of Abuja Teaching Hospital (UATH) Health Research Ethics Committee (UATH HREC), plans to upgrade its processing of applications to online platform. This gives the advantage of reducing the cost of printing, enable quicker submission process as applications does not require physical presence, expands the coverage of reviewers, and enhances our record keeping and makes us more environment friendly.

The online submission and review shall become active and commence accepting applications October 1st, 2020. However, the UATH HREC shall also maintain the old hard copy submission / review system through the 3 months transition period that ends December 31st, 2020. Thereafter, no hard copy submission shall be accepted by the UATH HREC.

This shall be achieved in collaboration with Viable Knowledge Masters® using REAPS. REAPS is an online software that has been designed to facilitate the easy submission, processing, tracking, and granting of ethics approval to individuals applying for research ethics approval from Institutional or Ethical Review Boards

### What is REAPS?

REAPS is an online software that has been designed to facilitate the easy submission, processing, tracking, and granting of ethics approval to individuals applying for research ethics approval from Institutional or Ethical Review Boards.

### Steps for Registration on REAPS:

1. Type in <https://reaps.com.ng> in your web browser.
2. Click on login on the top right-hand corner of the web page.
3. Click on register.
4. Fill in the form and click on Register.
5. An email will be sent to the email address used during the registration process, check your mailbox, and click on the verification link in the mail, to confirm registration.
6. Confirm registration enables one to submit proposal for assessment.

### Steps for Submission on REAPS:

1. Type in <https://reaps.com.ng> in your web browser.
2. Click on login on the top right-hand corner of the web page.
3. Enter your registered email address and password, click on login.

4. When you login to your account, click on Ethics Approval >> Request Ethics Approval.

5. Fill in the information as required by the institution, page 1-7.

6. On page 8, Upload evidence of payment for submission of application (Receipt of payment of appropriate amount).\*

7. On page 9, select the institution (UATH) you will be submitting the request to and click submit to make processing fee payment of N1,000.00 through pay stack with effect from 1st January 2021.

8. Click OK to confirm submission.

9. When your request has been approved you will receive and email notification.

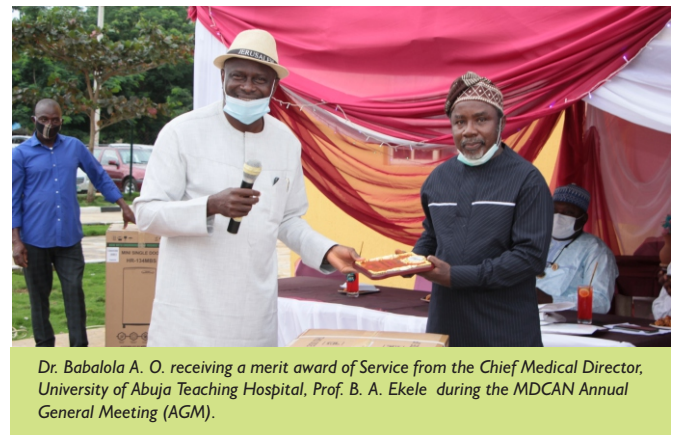

# CORONAVIRUS (COVID -19)

## PRECAUTIONS

7. Stay informed on the latest developments about COVID-19 through official channels on TV and Radio, NCDC and Federal Ministry of Health.
