Twenty-Six Years After, UATH Gets Right of Occupancy

he University of Abuja Teaching hospital now has a right of occupancy over the piece of land she currently occupies.

Breaking the news at a meeting with leaders of unions and associations in the hospital, the Chief Medical Director, Professor Bissallah Ekele said this had given the hospital legitimacy over the land and would speed up growth and development.

"More importantly, this would end illegal occupancy and encroachment by land speculators and their collaborators," the Chief Medical Director added.

Professor Ekele disclosed that the Top Management Committee had gone ahead to plant ornamental trees at the extremes of the land as the hospital's sign of authority over the yet to be developed part of the land in-lieu of perimeter fencing.

The Chief Medical Director commended Architect Yakubu A. Edicha of the Procurement Unit and the Honorable Minister of Federal Capital Territory, Malam Muhammed Bello for their role in securing the right of occupancy for the hospital's land. Leaders of the unions and associations commended the Chief Medical Director and members of the Top Management Committee for the feat.

The University of Abuja Teaching

Hospital was handed over to the Federal Ministry of Health in August, 1993 by the Federal Capital Development Authority, FCDA, without the right of occupancy.

UATH to Attain 450 Bed-Capacity Soon, CMD

hief Medical Director, University of Abuja Teaching Hospital, Professor B. Ekele says the desire of Management is to expand the current bed capacity of the hospital to four hundred and fifty.

This, the Chief Medical Director said would, to an extent, address the 'no bed space challenge' and change the age-long narrative of the hospital being a three – hundred and fifty bed space to that of four hundred and fifty. Professor Ekele stated this at an interactive session with representatives of unions and associations in the hospital.

He said the steps being taken include the expansion and extension of the Accident and Emergency unit, construction of an isolation complex and a Ward for the Department of Mental Health. Professor Ekele said some of the structures would be ready for use before the end of the year while others would be ready in 2020. In separate comments, representatives of the unions and associations commended the CMD for the vision. Unions and associations present at the interactive session include the Senior Staff Association, Medical and Dental Consultants' Association, Association of Resident Doctors, Medical and Health Workers' Union, Non-Academic Staff Union, National Association of Nigeria Nurses and Midwives as well as Nigerian Union of Allied Health Professionals.

Isolation Complex will Be Completed on Schedule, Perm Sec.

he isolation complex being constructed by the Federal Ministry of Health at the University of Abuja Teaching Hospital will be completed and put to use as scheduled.

Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Health, Alhaji Abdulaziz Abdullahi gave the assurance after visiting the project site to ascertain the level of work.

He charged the contractor, Mufo Polo Nigeria Limited, to be thorough in the execution of the project and deliver on schedule.

Alhaji Abdullahi disclosed that the Federal Ministry of Health was upto-date in funding of the project adding that there was no reason for the project not to be delivered as agreed.

Appreciating the Permanent Secretary for the commitment and assurances, the Chief Medical Director, University of Abuja Teaching Hospital, Professor Bissallah Ekele said the Management of the hospital was open for more projects adding that the hospital was blessed with more land space for development.

The isolation complex being constructed under the supervision of the Nigeria Centre for Disease Control has apartments for high and low risk clients and are further divided into male, female and children's wards with provisions for dialysis, intensive care and theatre. Exclusive Breastfeeeding Requires Family and Community Support, Prof. Airede

professsor of Perinatal-Neonatal Medicine and Paediatrics at the University of Abuja Teaching Hospital, Professor Kareem Airede has called for family and community support for mothers practicising exclusive breastfeeding in view of its inherent benefits to the new born, mother and the society.

Prof. Airede made the call in a lecture titled: "Supporting the Breast feeding Mother" he delivered at the 2019 World Breastfeeding Week celebration by the Department of Paediatrics of the University of Abuja Teaching

Hospital.

He said breast milk has been classified as food because it does not require universal precautions for handling body fluids.

Prof. Airede held that everything in breast milk comes from the mother's body and already custommade for her baby's needs adding that, this not only saves money for the family but also strengthens the bond between the baby and the mother.

The Professor noted that breastfed children come out healthier and with high reduction in morbidity and mortality. "Breastfeeding is best for growing infants for the first six months," he added.

Prof. Airede called for a policy that would promote work schedule flexibility for breastfeeding mothers as this would also enhance productivity in the work place of mothers and reduce huge loss in work hour.

He appealed to the mass media to portray breastfeeding as a norm while employers of labour should provide space and time to accommodate milk expression.

Health Care Needs Quality Laboratory Diagnosis, Dr. Onyeaghala

edical Laboratory Scientists have been charged to constantly work towards improving the quality of laboratory diagnosis with a view to obtaining better health indices for everyone and the nation in general.

Dr. Augustine Onyeaghala of the Department of Medical Science, University of Ibadan gave the charge in a paper at the 7th annual Scientific Workshop of the Association of Medical Laboratory Scientists of Nigeria, University of Abuja Teaching Hospital Chapter.

In the paper titled: "Practical and Translational Approach for Improving Quality Laboratory Operations," Dr. Onyeaghala said training, re-training and mentorship were key in the drive for excellence in laboratory diagnosis.

He said one of the challenges in Medical Laboratory Science was the lack of mentor-mentee relationship adding that one of the good qualities of any profession is the ability to mentor and grow younger ones.

Dr. Onyeaghala appealed to managements of the nation's health care facilities to develop institutional strategic plans that would strengthen laboratory systems in the country.

He argued that, to achieve any meaningful health system strengthening, the laboratory remained a critical area as it has the greatest impact on public health


